

Snail's Trail Block A

Fabric A

Cut 2 ea 2 1/2 inch squares

Cut 1 ea 2 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 3 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 4 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 6 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Fabric B

Cut 2 ea 2 1/2 inch squares

Cut 1 ea 3 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 4 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 6 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Pair the 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ squares in A and B pairing. Sew together and then sew 2 patch together to make a 4 patch.


Take one 3 inch triangle and sew to matching square. Do the same all the way around.

Take one 4 ½ inch triangle and sew to corresponding side. Continue all the way around.

Take one 6 ½ inch triangle and sew once again to corresponding side.

****Remember to line up middle point of triangle to center of 4 patch

Trim to 12 ½ inches.



Fabric A

Cut 1 ea 1 ½ inch square

Cut 1 ea 1 3/4 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 2 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 3 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 4 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 2 1/4 inch X 10 1/4 rectangle

Fabric B

Cut 1 ea 1 ½ inch square

Cut 1 ea 1 3/4 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 2 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 3 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 4 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 2 1/4 inch X 10 1/4 rectangle

Fabric C

Cut 1 ea 1 1/2 inch square

Cut 1 ea 1 3/4 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 2 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 3 ½ inch square cut diagonally once.

Cut 1 ea 4 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 2 1/4 inch X 10 1/4 rectangle.

Fabric D

Cut 1 ea 1 ½ inch square

Cut 1 ea 1 3/4 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 2 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 3 ½ inch square cut diagonally once.

Cut 1 ea 4 1/2 inch square cut diagonally once

Cut 1 ea 2 1/4 inch X 10 1/4 rectangle.

Follow to same directions as the two-color block. The difference is that you will need to keep each color in the same position.

The rectangle is sewn on with one partial seam. One the first rectangle, you will leave about ½ inch not sewn. Continue sewing on other rectangles and finish first rectangle last.
