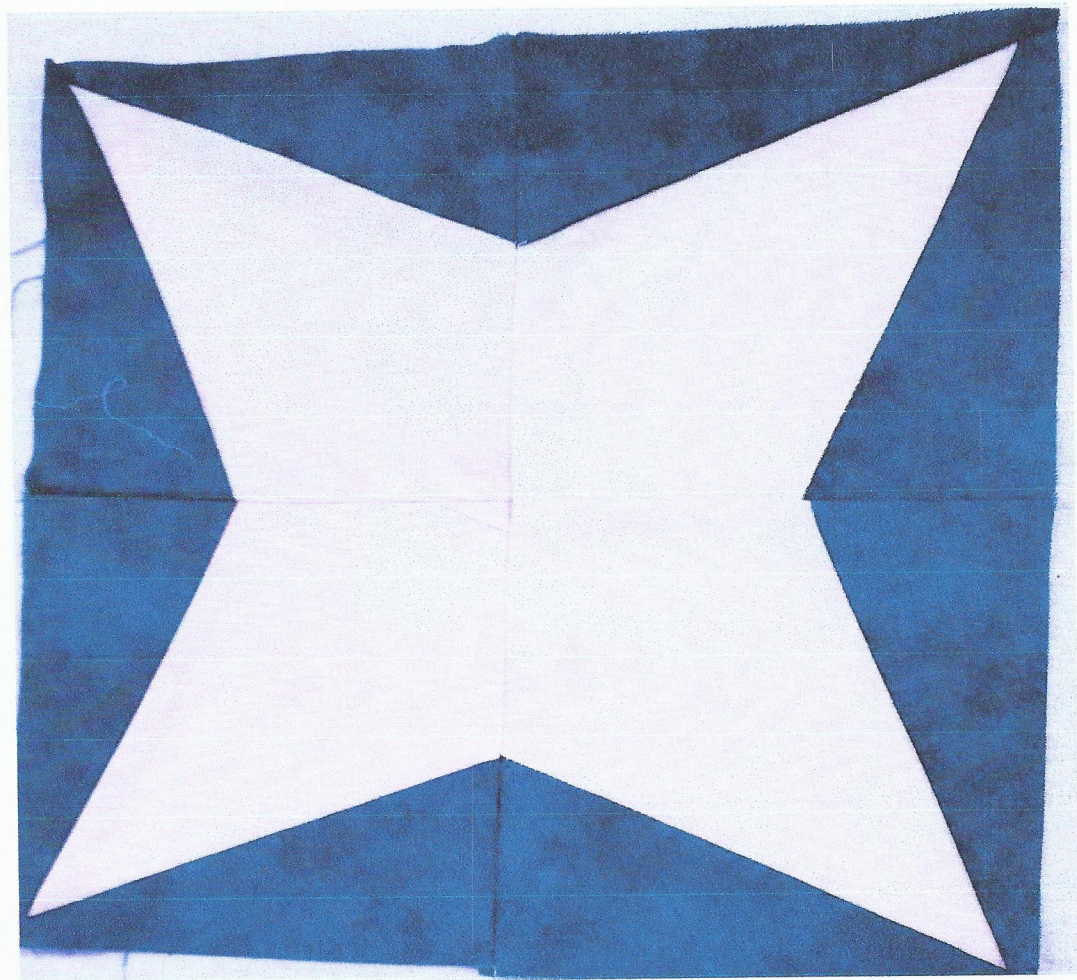
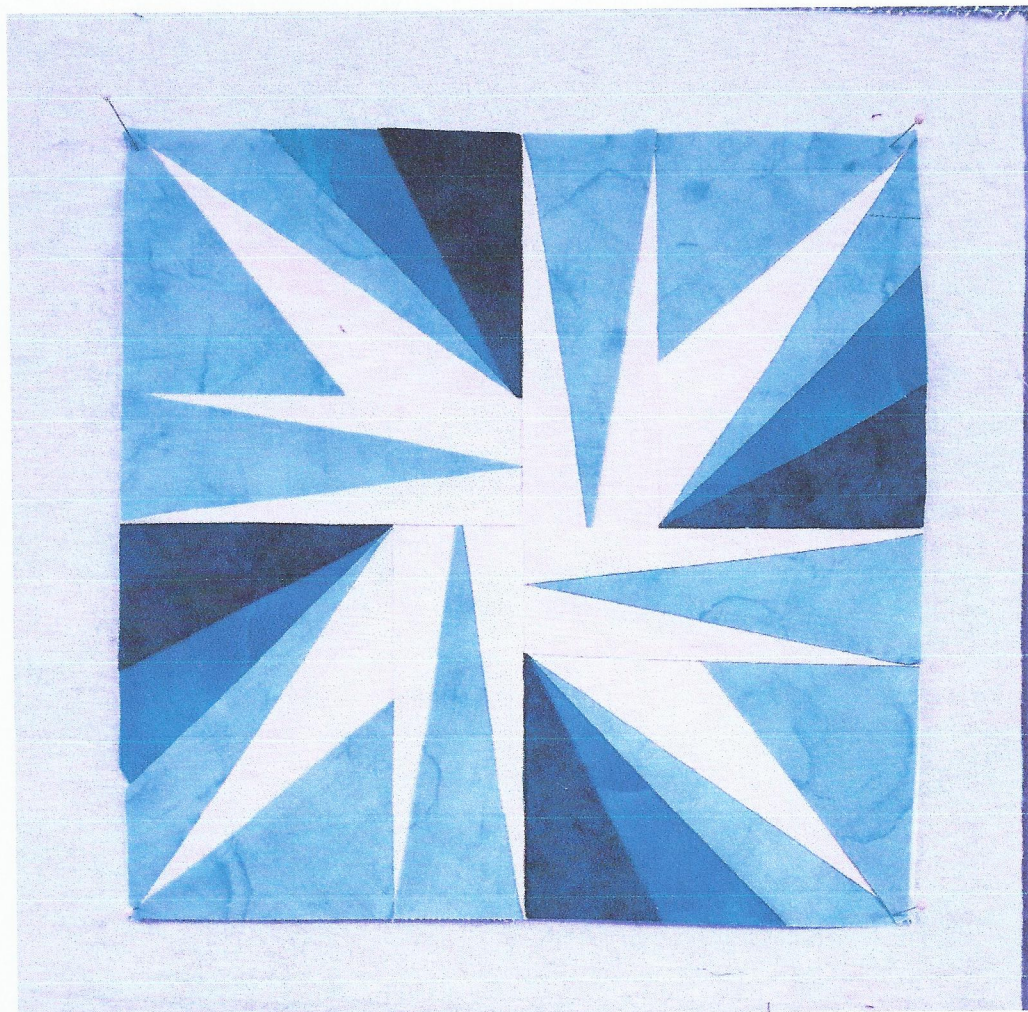


July BOM

Paper Piecing







There are many “papers” you may use for paper piecing. Some that make the list are bond paper, freezer paper, parchment, tissue paper, muslin and water dissolvable interfacing. Any of the above is acceptable. Use what you are comfortable with or is handy.

With your favorite ruler, measure each section. I, personally, cut my pieces at least one inch larger around the area.



Place your fabric for section 1 and 2 right face together with fabric for section 1 right side up on the blank side of the paper. Make sure you leave at least  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch for your seam allowance. Place the fabric for section 2 right face down so the two are right side to right side. Flip and sew along the first inside line. \*\*\* Fold paper back and trim to  $\frac{1}{4}$  in for seam. Press the fabric into place open. Fold back the line between section 2 and section 3. Fold on the printed side. Trim Section 2 to  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch. Place the next fabric right sides facing and flip and sew along the line. Repeat from \*\*\* and continue until all sections have been completed. Trim block to  $6\frac{1}{2}$  inch square. Sew blocks together, making sure you nest the seams.
